OVERNIGHT PARKING PERMITS

A City of Waupaca ordinance requires anyone parking in the public parking lots between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. to purchase a parking permit. The permits are available for purchase starting September 21st for the period ending September 30th of the following year. The cost of the permit is \$120.00 for the year.

WAUPACA WATER UTILITY ANNUAL FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Waupaca Water Utility's Annual Flushing Program will be done during the weeks of: September 24 – 28, 2023 during the hours of 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., and October 2 – October 6, 2023 during the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

This flushing of the water mains will remove most of the natural minerals such as iron that are harmless, but will discolor the water. If you see our staff working in your area, use as little or, if possible, no water for one-half to three quarters of an hour to ensure that the water has settled down and that the discoloration is not drawn into your home's water system. Should you find discoloration, stop using water, wait one-half to three quarters of an hour, then draw off the discolored water through the cold water only.

Your help and cooperation in this program will benefit all water consumers.

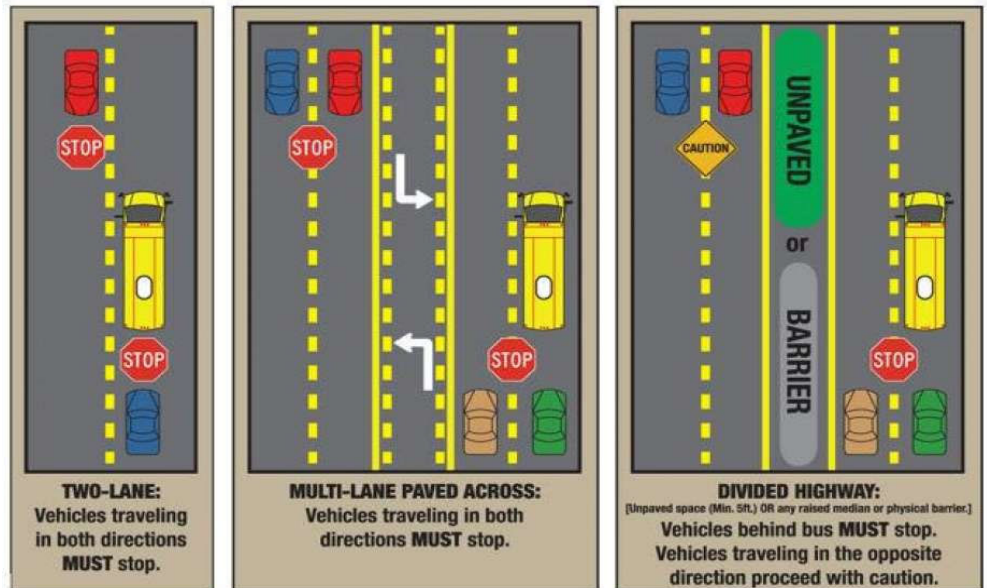

FEMA and FCC Plan Nationwide Emergency Alert Test for Oct. 4, 2023

The national test will consist of two portions, testing WEA and EAS capabilities. Both tests are scheduled to begin at approximately 2:20 p.m. ET on Wednesday, Oct. 4th.

The WEA portion of the test will be directed to all consumer cell phones. This will be the third nationwide test, but the second test to all cellular devices. The test message will display in either English or in Spanish, depending on the language settings of the wireless handset.

The EAS portion of the test will be sent to radios and televisions.

This will be the seventh nationwide EAS test.

The purpose of the Oct.4th test is to ensure that the systems continue to be effective means of warning the public about emergencies, particularly those on the national level. In case the Oct.4 th test is postponed due to widespread severe weather or other significant events, the back-up testing date is Oct. 11th.
