The Waupaca Police Department is releasing the following information found on the opposite side of this page pursuant to Wisconsin State Statute 301.45 and 301.46 (Act 440), which authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform the public of a sex offenders release when, at the discretion of the agency, the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense that requires registration with the local law enforcement agencies. Further, his/her previous criminal history places the offender in a classification level which reflects the potential to offend.

This sex offender has served the sentence imposed on him/her by the courts and has advised officials that he/she will be living in the location on the opposite side of this page. **THIS PERSON IS NOT WANTED BY THE POLICE AT THIS TIME.** THIS NOTIFICATION IS NOT INTENDED TO INCREASE FEAR; RATHER, IT IS OUR BELIEF THAT AN INFORMED PUBLIC IS A SAFER PUBLIC.

Sex offenders have always lived in our communities but it was not until the passage of Act 440 (which mandates sex offender registration) that law enforcement even knew where they were living. In many cases, law enforcement is now able to share that information with you. Citizen abuse of this information to threaten, intimidate or harass registered sex offenders will not be tolerated. Further, such abuse could potentially end law enforcements ability to do community notifications. We believe the only person who wins if community notification ends is the sex offender, since the sex offenders derive their power through secrecy.

As of September 18, 2023 there are a total of 26,507 registrants required to register in the State of Wisconsin. There are a total of 180 registrants in Waupaca County. If you have information regarding current criminal activity of this or any other sex offender, please call the Waupaca Police Department at (715) 258-4400 ext. 0. The Waupaca Police Department has been notified that David E. Disberry was previously released from prison and returning to the community. Disberry had been in prison after serving 15 years for a 2004 Waupaca County conviction of 2nd degree sexual assault and repeated sexual assault of same child. Disberry was convicted of sexually assaulting an 11-year old female acquaintance over the course of two years. He has a prior conviction in 1983 for 2nd degree sexual assault involving an adult female.

Disberry is on extended supervision until 12/02/2034. Special conditions of David E. Disberry's supervised release:

- 1.) No contact with victims, no unsupervised contact with minors, no presence in taverns, bars, or liquor stores, and no use of alcohol or illegal drugs.
- 2.) Comply with all rules of high risk sex offender supervision and cooperate with lifetime GPS monitoring.
- 3.) Face-to-face contact with law enforcement as required, lifetime registration with Wisconsin Sex Offender Registration Program.

David E. Disberry will be living at 534 S. Washington St. in the City of Waupaca as of September 20th, 2023.
